Student tardiness: This has been an ongoing issue here at W.E.S. As a school community we value others' time and the importance of planning ahead and the life skill of being responsible and on time. With daily lates ranging from 2-5 students (arriving after the 7:55 a.m. bell), we are concerned with the message students get from frequent tardiness, and also the disruption to their day, the teacher's instructions and other students' learning.

School closure due to bad weather: Periodically, schools are closed due to emergencies, power outages or because of heavy snowfalls. Only the transportation department in partnership with the school board can make the decision to close schools. Decisions are usually made by 6:00 a.m. and are often based on the ability of school buses to cover their routes safely.
